





Went further into "Bee" questions agreed to meet at Stuart's [Stuart Wing?] on Tuesday evening to prepare still further for Thursday evening first completion at St Germans.

January 5th Thursday

Met at Stuarts house and discussed "Calendar" etc., in view of competition on Thursday evening.

January 7th Saturday

Went to St Germans OB for "Bee" Competition. Result: Roseland 18pts St Germans 8 pts

January 8th Sunday

Jack Bice, George Knight & I went to Trussel Farm to hear and learn on competition between St Keynes & PeyInt Patrols.

January 10th Tuesday

AM Cleaned OB. Collected all empty cases from practice shoots. Lit fire in OB to dry out same. PM Further discussion on "Calendar" and automatic weapons in preparation for competition with Morval on Thursday night.

January 13th

I went to St Germans OB with Lt Mewton as marker in competition.

January 14th Thursday

Went to Sgt Julian's House at Morval to compete in round of "Bee" with Morval patrol.

January 17th Sunday

PM Patrol met at OB talk on next Thursday friendly "Bee" with PeyInt to take place at Council School. Went through "Calendar" H.E. speeds and automatic weapons.

January 31st Sunday

Went and heard "Bee Comp" Semi Final between Pelynt and Padstow. Pelynt won Albert Reeves signed Official Secrets Act and became a member of Aux Units.

February 4th Thursday

Talk by Captain Sergeant on his January visit to Highworth and general discussion.

February 7th Sunday

AM Cleaned OB in preparation for Sgt Rogers on Thursday. Put away recent issue of goods in operation and practice bins.

PM Tested .300 Rifle and miniature rifle practice (application).

February 11th Thursday

Sgt Rogers unable to attend to give lesson on map reading. Lt Mewton gave talk and lesson on prismatic compass.

February 14th Sunday

AM Overhauling targets. Setting up trip wires for operation in afternoon.

PM Attack car over course 30yds with 6 live trip wires and 4 duds. Patrol operated with night glasses on. Only one trip wire fouled.

Evening: Miniature .22 shoot with PeyInt at Looe. First time shooting in artificial light.

Result: PeyInt 117 & 145 Roseland 95 & 126

February 18th Thursday

Put Patrol in pairs & gave grid references to attack on map, plotted their course by compass. Four different routes given.

February 21st Sunday

AM Repairing and setting targets for shoot with cadets.



February 25th Thursday

Afternoon: Lieut Mewton, A. Reeves & myself made preparations to meet **Col. Atkins**. Set charges to two trees on main patch. Also one trip wire. 4.0pm Col arrived and spent one hour in OB. Capt. Dingley present. The Col seemed impressed with our work and the OB. He confirmed A. Reeves was released from the Homeguard to join us.

February 28th Sunday

Daylight attack on wireless car situated at? [un-named]? Roseland attacking from Tencreek Cottages [OS GRID REFERENCE: SX26357 63437 OS GRID COORDINATES: 226357, 63437]
St Keynes also operating in same attack but both patrols operating from near their own bases.





March 4th Thursday

Talk on attack (night) to be made on 4 dimmed lights. Inter patrol work. 3 sentries to remain within 50 yds. of lights & patrol of 4 to attack.

March 6th Saturday

Night Attack – Roseland starting from Highwood to attack Map Ref. 668863 (Moorswater Viaduct). Attack to start at 21.00hrs and end 24.00hrs. Moorswater was the starting point of St Keynes patrol to attack our lights at High wood. Myself Sgt Tom Williams, Jack Bice, Reg Babbage & Stuart Wing acted as patrol. Staff Tucker, George Knight, and Albert Reeves as sentries at Highwood.

Although no moon, bright starlight. My compass bearing to 205° Back 25°

March 11th Thursday

Post Mortem by Lt Mewton on daylight attack 28th Feb and also on night 6th March 1943. General discussion on future night attacks.

March 14th Sunday

AM inspection of arms. Talk on the "Sten", firing Sten over 30yds. Dummy bomb throwing PM "Bee" questions. 6 questions given from each member of the patrol. Also 8 questions put to each man by Lt Mewton

March 18th Thursday

Talk on map reading, various signs and quotations. General discussion arising on "Bee" questions. Talks on HE and how it detonates.

March 21st Sunday

AM & PM Repairs to OB. Fitting new shelves, an extra upright to help take weight of roof. Starting to make a new get away door.

March 25th Thursday

Recon for night attack on Cartuther Rookery on 27th. Lansallos Patrol visited Roseland and had a discussion on OB construction and method of attack on Cartuther.

March 27th / 28th Sat/Sun

SAT 22.00 to 01.00 hrs Night attack on Cartuther, Roseland, PeyInt, Morval, Lansallos, St Germans attacking with St Keynes defending. No moon, good starlight. Out of only six getting in and out Roseland provided three.

SUN PM Talk on previous nights attack. Checking & putting away new material which arrived same day and previous Thursday. Working on cupboard and door of get-away.

April 2nd Thursday

Working on cupboard and door of get-away. Clearing Air-Vents in OB

April 4th Sunday

AM Preparing targets etc.

PM Practice shoot with Cartuther Searchlight Battery and Dummy grenade practice.

Result: Roseland 358 pts Searchlight Batt. 313 pts

April 9th Friday

A Reeves equipment arrived . Issued the same to him via Capt Sergeant. Colt revolver No.? Working on get-away door. Talk on daylight operation for Sunday found by Grid Ref sent to me by Lieut. Mewton that objective will be situated at "Puckator". Read to Patrol orders received by me this week from H.Q.

April 11th Sunday

PM Daylight role. Recon of car on "Puckator" started from Barnicutts Blacksmith Shop worked as a whole patrol to quarry (St Cleer) until target was visible, then split singly. 5 out of 7 got in & out. Sleep & Knight being spotted by Lt Mewton who acted as sentry. Roseland 30 pts.



April 15th Thursdaye

Greased tops of all AW Bottles (ed.note: The Grenade, Hand, Anti-Tank No. 74, commonly known as the S.T. Grenade or sticky bomb, the grenade consisted of a glass sphere containing an explosive made of nitro-glycerine covered in a powerful adhesive, and surrounded by a sheet-metal casing. Fitted doors, shelves to get-away cupboard and general repairs and cleaning up of O.B.

April 18th Sunday

AM Working on get-away

PM Recon of Coldrenrick Woods & House. Possible headquarters for Germans in case of invasion. Made landmarks for best way to attack. House grounds ideal for tanks & lorries. Good hard roads covered by trees.

April 22nd Thursday

Ten minute lecturette from each member of patrol on items of interest noticed on Sunday recon. Various tracks, land marks etc. Also general discussion on future methods of getting to know country.

April 25th Sunday

AM Revolver practice & Demolitions. Lt Mewton present

PM Daylight recon of approach to Coldrenick House from the S, SE & SW. Started from Round House Hill (Lower Lodge) went through Tresulgan, Trebrowne Valley, followed valley on through Trehurst & Treniddick then took to high ground to reach Padderbury Top for observation. Took the same way back so as to know ground for any attack on Coldrenick House to be made from the South side. [see separate training page].

April 27th Tuesday

PM Recon of Downderry Radio Location Station for possible attack on Friday night.

April 29th Thursday

Talk previous to attack on Downderry. Capt. Sergeant & Lt Mewton explained what was expected of us to do. Planned method etc.

Left Liskeard 19.30 to go to Cartuther Rookery to lay trip wires etc. 23.00 started to defend

the same (Inter Patrol Competition). Operation ended 02.00

May 2nd Sunday

May 8th Saturday

Attack on Cartuther Rookery started at 23.00

Small arms inspection by Capt. Sergeant. Re-winding used trip wire etc.

Started to make a door for OB as requested by HQ.

May 23rd Sunday



PATROL MEMBERS (Mentioned in Diary):

Sgt Tom Williams Senior. Menheniot Lorry Driver - Promoted to Cpl 4th June 1942. Became Patrol Commander Nov 26th 1942.

Stafford Tucker Owner and Manager of Roseland quarry were OB was.

Stuart W Wing joined 13th Dec 1942 discharged to HM Forces 7th Feb 1943

Albert H Reeves A Slaughter man. Joined 31st Jan 1943.

Robert S Sleep of 11 Pound Street Liskeard, a salesman in an ironmongers.

Reg Babbage a Quarry worker. Polpinka, Menheniot. He broke his arm Sept 17th

George Knight a lorry driver of 2 lvy Cottage, Pound St Liskeard

Jack P Bice an agent for Watkins and Rosevearne Motors & Cornish All-in wrestling champion.

Left May 30th 1943 possibly to become a Patrol Leader of another Patrol nearby.

Raymond E. Bowen left Patrol Mar 5th 1942

Richard Warne a farmer and market gardener. Joined 27th June 1943

Williams Junior Not named in Nominal Roll – Perhaps a relative of T. Williams allowed to shoot.

On Nominal Roll not named in diary:

H Body Nom.Roll address Looe Mills, Liskeard.

OBSERVATIONS/COMMENTS

Period covered – 16 Oct 1941 to 26 Sept 1943 – 710 days. During this period there were 240 days training in addition to their normal employment.

Trained two or three days every week. Regular shooting and competitions against nearby Patrols which kept the patrol very active and efficient.

Inter patrol competitions held by visiting each other's OB's and ranges. Roseland patrol generally won these competitions.

Aux Patrols normally beat the Homeguard Units.

Some Targets appear to be quite a distance from Roseland - Trekeive Steps and Downderry Radio Location Station for example were 9 miles. I assume that travel to targets was on foot.

Having said that the patrol did go to Porthpean Training Centre which was 23 miles from Roseland OB so transport would have been available. Likewise for those who went to GHQ Coleshill.
