The War Diary of Major Raven of Hoxne Auxiliary Units References Intelligence Officer is Captain Andrew Croft Auxiliary Units are referred to as 'Mobile Squad'

Starts May 14th 1940

August 5 1940 Major Croft called to form Mobile Squad to work with road blocks. Ten to be detailed to meet him here at 8pm Thursday 15.

August 8 [writing in a different hand] - To South Green, Sailor's Pool & Dickinson's Pit for site for Croft's demonstration & for Sailor's Pool post with Wright.

August 10 Typed orders etc. After Lunch Cpt Croft called wishing to advance time of demonstration from Thursday to Tuesday evening: he went on to see Wright: settled for Tuesday. Buck to bring over contingent from Stadbrooke too.

August 13 7.30 pm Demonstration by Capt Croft at Dickinson's attended by 4 regular Captains. Revillon and contingent from Stadbrooke under Buck along with our own. Arranged for a further practice next Tuesday at 7.15 [Oposite page of diary, in pencil] Croft left cases of S.I.P Bottles [self igniting phorous] 12 in case. 9 on the 16th

August 16 Re-typed lists of men. All men to register with Police. 12 o'clock Croft called to discuss new squad and leader etc 7 o'clock Wright called to discuss above.

[Original hand takes over writing]

August 20 Captain Wills, 2nd Kensingtons. Demonstrated at Dickinson's – 12 present. Instructed G Thirkettle verbally that he would be put in charge of the Mobile Squad. To come and see me one night at about 9pm.

August 21 sent details [on oposite page] of mobile squad to Croft

August 21 8 o'clock Went through Calandar 1937 with George Thirkettle til 9.15

August 26 Wrote to Captain Wills, 2nd Kensingtons, Claydon

August 28 Saw Gordon Whitton [Auxilier]

September 3 Captain Croft called at 12.20pm 8pm G Thirkettle to see me – gave him details of Mobile Squad arranged to meet on Sat and dig up necessaries.

September 7 Removed box of tricks and handed over to G Thirkettle. [Opposite page - in pencil] Removal of H.E [High Explosives] to Thirkettle's Farm 4

September 8 2.40am Sent Edward and George Thirkettle round with S.I.P Bottles. [suspected Cromwell Alert]

September 17 Captain Croft to see me about Mobile Squad.

September 18 G Thirkettle wants to make a secret rendezvous of M.S [Mobile Squad] on Rushes land [Cpl 'Ken' Rush]

Sepember 24 G Thirkettle and R Rush to see whether a 'hidey-hole' can be found for mobile squad. Wants pass

September 25 Sent Thirkettle a pass.

September 27 Corporal G Thirkettle to Mobile Squad's course with Croft. Major E Borrow supplied 8 petrol coupons to be refunded by Capt Croft.

October 4 5pm Captains Croft and Bush called about returning coupons for Mobile Squad – 8 coupons to HQ.

November 3 G Thirkettle came to see me about hide out for mobile section

February 15 1941 Made out complete list of personnel up to date for Major F.T Wright. Strength 134 excluding Dickinson, E.J.P.R and H.P.R [Raven] and mobile squad of seven.

March 8 Return to Majors Borrow and Wright as to equipment issued to Mobile Squad from Platoon Stores and that issued by Captain Croft of mobile unit.

April 7 Rejoined for duty with No.1 Corporal C.A. Brett, A. R. Riches, and A. J. Whatling [Originally recorded as being from Denham]
